

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2

Memorializes the 2013 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will increase awareness of the responsibilities driving encompasses and to reduce the number of irresponsible drivers by adding more requirements to obtain a Nevada driver's license, before the age of eighteen (18).

WHEREAS, At present, all the current requirements to obtain a Nevada driver's license are to remain; and

WHEREAS, At the age of sixteen (16) a driver must present an official transcript with a G.P.A. of at least 2.0 (unweighted) and with no failing classes; and

WHEREAS, The established G.P.A. will motivate drivers of Nevada to obtain higher and better grades; and

WHEREAS, At age sixteen (16), a driver must have an adequate attendance record with no truancies which will therefore decrease the amount of students skipping school; and

WHEREAS, At age sixteen (16), a driver must not have, in school, behavioral issues in school such as suspension, expulsion, or a Required Parent Conference (R.P.C.), et cetera; and

WHEREAS, At age sixteen (16), a driver must not have a history of a failed drug test; and

WHEREAS, All teen drivers will become aware of the great responsibility and challenge that driving encompasses; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS' STAE OF NEVADA, assembled in Carson City on July 1, 2011, that the 2013 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to increase awareness of the responsibilities driving encompasses and to reduce the number of irresponsible drivers by adding more requirements to obtain a Nevada driver's license before the age of eighteen (18).
