

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 7

Memorializes the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislator to enact legislation that will provide protection for all Nevada State Wildlife, endangered or not, through stricter hunting regulations and penalizing off-road vehicle use outside of allowed areas that would be regulated by Nevada government rather than private corporations and land owners.

WHEREAS, Local food chains are often negatively affected by overgrowth or lack of natural supply because non-endangered species are dying off rapidly; and

WHEREAS, Off-road and highway accidents are some of the top detriments to desert wildlife in that they kill around one million animals annually; and

WHEREAS, Funding, penalty, and fining be supported by local police departments and legal officers; and

WHEREAS, If not immediately addressed, constantly more species will be added to the endangered species list; and

WHEREAS, If addressed immediately, less funding and taxation will be needed to protect Nevada wildlife in years to come because of sponsored, thriving communities relayed in this legislation; and

WHEREAS, Over hunting and poaching cause irregularity in the ecosystem and push certain communities into new habitats like cities and towns making for dangerous situations; therefore be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA assembled in Carson City on June 26, 2015 that the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to provide protection for all Nevada wildlife, regardless of status by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
