

NEVADA GIRLS STATE  
ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8

Memorializes the 2017 session of Nevada Girls to enact legislation that will provide in-depth instruction for hospitalized students of an extended period of time at the same pace as in-class instruction providing the permission from the student's doctor or healthcare provider is given.

WHEREAS, Participating in familiar activities helps children and teens cope by reducing the stress of hospitalization; and

WHEREAS, The lack of a real-time school program can lead to failure of the student to complete the high school credits required to graduate; and

WHEREAS, Any school system currently employed in hospitals is a privately run system, ending any great allowance of a smooth transition back into the classroom; and

WHEREAS, Whatever amount of money is spent per student the school district will in turn give to the hospital caring for the student; and

WHEREAS, Students hospitalized for one month or less will be provided tutors free of charge by the school district rather than in-hospital instruction; therefore be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA assembled in Carson City on June 26, 2015 that the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to allow hospitalized students of one month or more to learn and complete assignments in real-time with their classroom based peers through a public school related system of learning funded by the individual student's school district given the allowance by the doctor responsible for the student's care.
