

NEVADA GIRLS STATE  
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 12

Memorializes the 2015 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will implement a course concerning the equality of parenting for family court judges along with the yearly Continuing Legal Education (CLE) classes required by the State Bar of Nevada.

WHEREAS, When fighting a custodial battle in court trials need to be fair; and

WHEREAS, Both mothers and fathers are capable of taking care of their child when one decides to leave; and

WHEREAS, When family court judges are given the information and knowledge from the CLE courses they will have it fresh in their minds; and

WHEREAS, Each custodial trial is different and judges will be better prepared for deciding in whose custody the child belongs; and

WHEREAS, In the state of Nevada it is harder for males to obtain custody of their child, and

WHEREAS, Children will have less of a chance to be placed in wrongful care; and

WHEREAS, Social security services will be used less because they will not be needed to investigate cases involving the parents of children, it will already be investigated by family court judges; therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA, assembled in Carson City on July 3, 2014 that the 2015 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to implement a course concerning the equality of parenting for family court judges along with the yearly Continuing Legal Education (CLE) classes required to maintain their licenses.
