

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 7

Memorializes the 2013 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will raise the legal age to 18.

WHEREAS; Currently, it is more likely that teenagers will be involved in a crash; and

WHEREAS; Most teenagers have poor hazard awareness, causing them to put other drivers into danger including themselves; and

WHEREAS; It is more common for teenagers no to wear their seat belts; and

WHEREAS; Special circumstances would be if a teenager graduates high school at an age younger than 18 he/she will be able to get their license due to future schooling, if a 16 year old is working then he/she will be allowed to receive their drivers' license; and

WHEREAS; The abuse of alcohol and/or drugs is one of the main causes of crashes and/or fatal crashes, teenager are at much of a higher risk of a serious crash than older drivers due to the amount of alcohol in their blood; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA, assembled in Carson City on July 6, 2012, that the 2013 Session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation, to make it that teenagers receive their drivers' license at 18 years old.
