

NEVADA GIRLS STATE  
ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 15

Memorializes the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation to allow driverless cars to be put on the market in the Nevada business industry and will further be allowed on all Nevada roadways.

WHEREAS, Artificial intelligence systems, which are progressively becoming notable and significant in the job industry, shall be allowed to serve as a “driver” on Nevada roadways; and

WHEREAS, Google cars and various other driverless car systems have been tested and are approved for roadways on a federal level; and

WHEREAS, These artificial intelligence systems as recognized by the National Highway Traffic and Security Administration will require a constituent in the driver seat who has possession of insurance and a driver’s license; and

WHEREAS, The driver who is registered for such a vehicle will be held accountable if the car experiences a fault but will not be held accountable if the system is overridden by a third party; and

WHEREAS, The driver will also not be held accountable if a second party is determined to be responsible for any accident which may occur; and

WHEREAS, Nevada’s Department of Transportation will be responsible for providing further regulations for governing Driverless Vehicles; therefore be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA assembled in Carson City on July 1, 2016 that the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to allow driverless cars to be put on the market in the Nevada business industry and will further be allowed on all Nevada roadways.
