

NEVADA GIRLS STATE  
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 7

Memorializes the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will permit solar companies to serve as an alternative source to non-solar generated energy for residential and commercial use.

WHEREAS, Solar energy companies have moved out of the State due to Nevada Energy's monopolistic tendencies; and

WHEREAS, Nevada Energy prevents other potential energy providers from combating greenhouse gas emissions and reduces the collective dependence on fossil fuel; and

WHEREAS, According to *Earth Island*, use of solar energy is correlated with a drop in air pollution; and

WHEREAS, Solar power plants are employing dry cooling techniques to reduce their water needs by as much as 95 percent; and

WHEREAS, Underutilized land can be used to install solar panels for production of energy while simultaneously increasing the value of the land; and

WHEREAS, Loss of wasted energy in the process of converting to energy from the source is reduced; and

WHEREAS, Grid security will be created and used to prevent properties from experiencing blackouts and/or electrical difficulties; and

WHEREAS, An increase in demand for solar energy will result in employment growth, reducing the unemployment rate; and

WHEREAS, Consumers are given the freedom upon selecting the preferred method of an energy source; therefore be it
