

**NEVADA GIRLS STATE  
SENATE BILL NO. 10**

AN ACT that will regulate the distribution and usage of hostile architecture surrounding and displayed within public buildings and areas.

Section 1: Hostile architecture is defined as the implementation of aggressive agricultural elements with the public realm which are used to control human behavior, most notably movements of the homeless individuals. Hostile architecture may include spikes on the ground or branches on trees, sloped and bolted benches, armrests on benches, spiked window sills, segmented benches, awning gaps, barred corners, street dividers, raised grate covers, tiered seating, folders under bridges, and retractable spikes.

Section 2: Areas who permit the usage of hostile architecture within public areas shall rescind such and destroy any and all remains of aggressive construction.

Section 3: Any implementation of hostile architecture will henceforth be fined and ownership of the land will be fined \$250 per square foot.

Section 4: District leaders will work in conjunction with local police who shall report instances of hostile architecture currently in place as well as any installation.

Section 5: This act will be effective upon passage.
