

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 10

Memorializes the 2015 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation to restrict private schools from participating in NIAA events and becoming NIAA members due to unfair advantages and will not be awarded with NIAA titles, grants, or special recognition.

WHEREAS, Private schools are not bound by zoning regulations and are thus able to recruit players and provide them with superior training and facilities; and

WHEREAS, The NIAA should promote equality to evoke healthy competition among schools; and

WHEREAS, College scouts give special scholarships to athletes coming from excelling high schools; and

WHEREAS, If it were allowed for public schools, coaches and teachers would scout and recruit the best athletes and scholars from different communities and parts of the country; and

WHEREAS, Private schools offer benefits and financial aid to desirable students; and

WHEREAS, Public schools struggle to train the minds and bodies of students within their particular zones provided by the school district; and

WHEREAS, Private schools often have more funding from donors to create dominating facilities and hire outstanding trainers; and

WHEREAS, Nevada State Legislature recognizes NIAA as the governing body of secondary school athletics and activities in Nevada; and

WHEREAS, A separate league for private schools can be created to eliminate advantages private schools have over public schools; and

WHEREAS, National media has created a negative perspective on the performance of public schools and Nevada because of the domination of private schools in NIAA; therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA, assembled in Carson City on July 3, 2014, that the 2015 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to deny NIAA membership to private schools due to unfair advantages among students.
