NEVADA GIRLS STATE SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9

Memorializes the 2017 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will require all public education classes to have a limit of twenty children per class in order to improve student's education.

WHEREAS, In the United States, Nevada has been ranked the lowest in education; and

WHEREAS, An improved working environment would be available to students; and

WHEREAS, There would be an increased amount of interaction between the teacher and individual; and

WHEREAS, Student behavior can be more closely monitored and controlled; and

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA, assembled in Carson City on June 26, 2015, the 2017 Session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorializes to enact legislation to improve public education by reducing the number of students per class to twenty.
