

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 15

Memorializes the 2019 session of the Nevada Legislature to enact legislation that will require all persons age 70 and above to pass a practical driving test to ensure safe roadways as a preventive measure against drivers every four years when they renew their license.

WHEREAS, Written and vision/medical examinations do not reflect a driver's characteristics and/or tempers; and

WHEREAS, Elderly drivers may suffer from many conditions such as slower reflexes and arthritis, which negatively impact their ability to safely operate a motor vehicle; and

WHEREAS, Many elderly drivers may use medications, the effects of which may negatively impact their ability to safely operate a motor vehicle; therefore be it

WHEREAS, Early identification could help prevent a fatal crash involving those who have lost the ability to be efficient and safe drivers; and

WHEREAS, Older people may not be aware of new regulations and should be reevaluated and reminded of new and old laws; and

RESOLVED BY THE GIRLS STATE OF NEVADA assembled in Carson City on June 30, 2017 that the 2019 session of the Nevada Legislature is hereby memorialized to enact legislation to will require all persons age 70 and above to pass a practical driving test every four years.
