NEVADA GIRLS STATE ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 27

AN ACT that will protect public transportation (bus stops and train stations) from Immigration and Naturalization Services (INS) agents.

SECTION 1: Preventing public transportation stations to have INS on the area protects both citizens and innocent immigrants.

SECTION 2: Having INS at public transportation stations create fear and anxiety for citizens of color in the state of Nevada.

SECTION 3: Having immigration raids creates fear for immigrants to use public transportation who are the highest populations who use and pay for public transportation, mainly buses.

SECTION 4: The money from transportation pays for the maintenance, construction, and debt service for public transportation, so having a large number of people use it helped the amount of money that can go to these things.

SECTION 5: Immigration raids have life-long effects on their children, who may frequently be citizens of the United States, causing trauma to young American citizens.

SECTION 6: The presence of INS at public transportation stations does not bring safety, it brings fear. INS is not a protection service.

SECTION 7: Having INS in public transportation stations creates a higher chance of arresting United States' citizens by accident, creating an unsafe environment for citizens.

SECTION 8: This Act would save money as it would allow INS agents more time to focus on immigrants who commit actual crimes

SECTION 9: Having INS at these stations may prevent police officers from being in the area.

SECTION 10: This issue creates fear among citizens who are people of color when dropping off family members visiting from another state or country at transportations stations.

SECTION 11: This ACT will be effective upon passage.
