

NEVADA GIRLS STATE
ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 32

AN ACT that will levy a 6% tax on alcohol sales for 8 years for educational building construction fees and a 2% tax on gaming revenue beginning in 2 years for teacher salary in order to establish a maximum student to teacher ratio of 20 to 1 in secondary school classrooms.

SECTION 1: News reports indicate that Nevada has one of the highest student to teacher ratios in the nation. Many students in Nevada secondary schools have classes with more than 30 students and one teacher.

SECTION 2: National rankings place Nevada near the bottom of states when it comes to educational attainment and school quality.

SECTION 3: Establishing smaller student to teacher ratios will result in a more personalized education experience for students. This will increase student comprehension and overall performance in the classroom.

SECTION 4: A standard teacher to student ratio will decrease the amounts of classes that are overfilled and overflowing with students. Some classrooms barely have the necessary amount of desks to house students for the class period. These giant classes create distractions and a buzz that is louder than the teacher.

SECTION 5: A standard teacher to student ratio will decrease the stress that teachers face during the school year. Teachers will be able to spend less time on class management and more time on teaching important content.

SECTION 6: This ACT will be effective upon passage.
